Funds, Volunteers Needed for Upcoming Summer Feeding Program

Food insecurity for children continues to be a significant problem in our country, especially in Arkansas. A few years ago, Arkansas was ranked first in our country for food insecurity, but with the hard work from various organizations and their volunteers, it now is ranked ninth. Unfortunately, 23% of our children in Arkansas continue to live in poverty. As you know, last summer was a tremendous success with the Summer Feeding Program providing over 13,500 lunches for a total of over 28,000 lunches since 2014. Plans are to serve lunches from June 3 - July 26 at Sheridan High School, Poyen First Assembly of God, Leola Missionary Baptist Church, and The Well in East End. Also, volunteers will deliver meals in Sheridan, Clearwater, and East End.

Our church will volunteer the first week of the program, June 3-7. We will need volunteers to distribute meals at our church and at Sheridan High School, as well as volunteers to deliver lunches in our community. Also, because our church is the hub for deliveries of meals and distribution of them, we need a volunteer each day of the program throughout the summer to assist volunteers with preparing for delivery. Please let Sandra Turner or me know if you can volunteer, or you can sign up on the sheet located in the narthex.

We have received two grants already; one from the ARUMCs 200,000 Reasons to Fight Childhood Hunger and one from the Arkansas Hunger Relief Alliance. Additionally, we have received donations from Sheridan White Rock, People's Bank, Apple Home Builders, and the Rotary Club.

It costs approximately \$1,000 per day to provide meals, which means we will continue to need donations. This mission is growing and is reaching out to more of the hungry children in our community! If you would like to donate to this mission, please mark your envelope or make your check to Summer Feeding Program.

From the Pastor's Desk....

Jesus said, "Come, follow me." Matthew 4:19

When Sara was two years old, she was fascinated with birds. She commented on their songs when she heard them in the morning and desperately wanted to interact with them when



playing in the yard. We took her to the Winged Wonders show at the Little Rock Zoo, and that nearly held her attention for 45 minutes – some sort of record for a two-year-old, I'd say!

There was a time when we were in our backyard, and a robin fluttered down to the ground about twenty feet from where she was standing. The robin began hopping around, and Sara was enthralled. "Come here, wittle birdie!" she called. Somehow, Sara knew that running pell-mell toward the robin would not end with contact, so she stayed on the porch, calling for that "wittle birdie" to come to her. Needless to say, it did not, and soon flew into a tree, much to Sara's disappointment.

I'm afraid that God is so often disappointed that we do not "Come, follow Him" when God calls to us. God is such an inviting God. Scripture reveals that every time God worked closely with people, it was due first to an invitation. God did not command Mary to give birth to Jesus; he invited her to. Jesus did not command the disciples to become his followers; he invited them to. Jesus didn't even command Thomas to believe but invited Thomas to put his fingers into his wounds.

It is so easy for us to get caught up with the "Thou shalts" and "Thou shalt nots" that we often miss the fact that what God wants most is a loving, trusting relationship with us... and that God knows that we must enter into that relationship willingly and without reservation. When we think about making disciples of Jesus Christ and bringing new people into our church, it is tempting to think that it must be done with clever marketing or worse, with shaming and guilt. But if we are careful to remember our own walk of faith, it almost certainly began with an invitation; an invitation from a parent or a friend, and an invitation from God. God calls, and God invites. It would seem that God's favorite word is "Come."
